Westchester Residents to Gather at Rainbeau Ridge Farm in Bedford Hills as Part of Nationwide Call to Action on Global Warming.

WHAT: Westchester residents concerned about the catastrophic effects of global warming will gather in Bedford Hills on Saturday, April 14, to challenge elected officials to put America on the path towards reducing carbon emissions 80% by 2050.

The event is part of the **Step it Up 2007** campaign, the largest day of citizen action focusing on global warming in our nation's history. The Bedford Hills event is sponsored by The Nature Conservancy Eastern New York Chapter, Westchester Land Trust, [Riverkeeper](#), Federated Conservationists of Westchester, New York League of Conservation Voters, Beaver Dam Sanctuary, and Citizens Campaign for the Environment.

The day will feature tours of Rainbeau Ridge Farm, information tables and exhibits by local groups and merchants, and short speeches by officials including Westchester County Executive Andrew Spano.
